



#### NEEDS AND OPPORTUNITIES RELATED TO THEME

- 1A. Communication Challenges exist when sharing information with year-round and seasonal residents regarding programs, strategies, incentives, etc. for implementing resiliency measures.
- 1B. Education There is a lack of understanding regarding natural resources and systemic dynamics relating to shoreline protection.
